Ladies' Team Manager

Hi, Jane Simpson here!

As the new YBA Ladies Team Manager I would like to introduce myself and let you know what is happening with YBA Ladies Bowls.

Many of you already know me but for those who don't, I have been a bowler for over 30 years starting (like many do) at a small village club in Riccall near York (the same club that Indoor World Champion Rebecca Field – now Wilgress, started out at when she was at primary school). I moved on to Selby BC, where I currently play, and have been in the County team for over 25 years. I qualified as a marker in my early days but sadly could not dedicate the time to switch to Umpire due to work commitments at the time, but the measuring experience I learnt has never been wasted. I play outdoors, indoors and short mat so have an all-round understanding of the game and have spent time assisting new members (in all disciplines) to find their feet on the rink.

Taking over the Team Manager role after last season, I have found it to be at an exciting time as Bowls England and the Bowls Development Alliance (and other National bodies) are making great efforts to grow the Sport for one and all. As part of their initiatives, all aspects of the Sport are being reviewed and developed to ensure it is accessible, inclusive, performance based, fun and fit for the future.

As a progressive County, we have access to this immense resource and their support to grow our own talent pool here in Yorkshire. There is a wealth of bowling experience and talent across the County so YBA will be looking to retain and develop our experienced players and identify and develop our newer talent whilst providing a pathway for higher level selection.

New formats have been introduced for the Walker Cup (Ladies) and Balcomb (Men) so the Double Rink format has disappeared (which is a shame) but the introduction of a 'Top Club' format will give a renewed focus and be able to draw on our player's strengths whilst still being a team. These will be played over a weekend at regional venues to create a concentrated competition and give opportunity to Bowls England to assess County talent. As we move towards a more integrated County, the introduction of a National Over 60s Mixed Inter County competition will, I am sure, prove to be popular for nominations.

We are never too old to learn, and we are never too old to pass on our collective experience to those coming through so the Coaching Culture being adopted at a higher level will, I am sure, feed down and ensure that we make the most of our extensive bowling expertise. Coaching bursaries are available for those wanting to pursue this vital role so why not consider it?

This is just a snapshot but as the Ladies Team Manager I am particularly keen to ensure our two Ladies teams are tight knit, up for the challenge, continue to develop, perform to the best of their ability and most of all continue to have fun.

It must be spring it's snowing outside!! Irrespective of the weather we will shortly be switching the warmth of indoor bowling for the character building outdoors!! The YBA Men's backroom staff have seen a few changes over the winter period. Sam Winter remains the Team Manager, but he has a new Alsop Captain in Lee Coutts, who takes over from Graham Stephenson who we sincerely thank for such loyal and vital support in the role over many years. We also have a new Youth Development Manager in Dave Attwood who takes over from Phil Parsons who has helped so many young bowlers develop over very many years. Dave will bring his experience from managing national youth squads into our County, working with Cressida Fordy (Ladies' Youth Development Manager)and Lee Coutts (YBA County Coach). Mike Bruce is the YBA Men's Competition Secretary, (mikebruce.yba@gmail.com) a key role for all who enjoy the various competitions that are available for players at a national and County level. (Please note the 2025 competition draws are now available in the Men's Section of the YBA website.)

Our County Teams will be playing for Yorkshire in various National Competitions:

Balcomb Trophy - to be held at Borough Park, Redcar BC on the weekend of the 17/18th May. This year sees a new format - gone is the double rink and in are Singles/Pairs/Triples and Fours. More details on the website in due course but we will be doing battle with the Northern Counties of Northumberland, Durham, Cumbria and Lancashire, seeking to qualify for the semi-finals at Leamington.

Middleton Cup - Four matches to get through on a round robin basis this year: Lancashire (14th June) & Cumbria (5th July) both away and Northumbria (12th July) and Durham (7th June) at home (Selby BC). An early season Squad Day will be held on the all-weather surface at Yarm BC (more details to follow).

Alsop Trophy - Having just missed out on the Alsop Trophy last year we aim to go one place better this season with the usual fixtures against Cumbria, Lancashire, Northumberland and Durham. All match details will be listed on our website.

White Rose - Our U24 squad will be in action as this event takes place on a regional basis with singles/pairs/triples and fours over the weekend of 31st May and the 1st June at Northallerton BC. Yorkshire will be taking on Durham, Cumbria, Northumberland and Lancashire

Mixed Inter County - A new BE National competition for players over 60. Six rinks (12 men 12 ladies), more details to follow.

Many dates here for both players' and spectators' diaries - more info to come via Bowls Yorkshire (Facebook) and our YBA website.

If you are interested in nominating play for Yorkshire, just head over to the YBA website and fill in the nomination form <u>County Nominations-Yorkshire Bowling Association-Yorkshire Bowling Association</u>, <u>York</u>.

Finally, the long-awaited shift towards a new YBA kit starts in 2025 with navy blue below the waist. More information will follow shortly on this matter, so don't go buying new white shorts/trousers for the 2025 season!!

Men's Competitions

The draws for the 2025 Men's County Competitions took place at the start of March and they are all on the County website. All entrants have been emailed with the relevant draws and have also had the relevant zone entrant contact details email to them. Contact details can also be accessed through the secure portal on the website. Yorkshire are one of only 9 counties whose entries for 2025 have gone up from both a 2022 and a 2024 baseline. That's really encouraging as the strength of the county lies in as many bowlers as possible playing top level competitive bowls. We will know whether we qualify for two entrants in each discipline at the National Finals at Learnington in the next few weeks, but the signs are very optimistic.

As the bowling greens now start to open and competitors look towards offering or accepting dates this is a good opportunity to remind everyone of the points made in my email to entrants:

1. I have used the number of entries in each zone to determine the number of qualifiers for the Quarter Finals. In each discipline the ratios were the same; 3 qualifiers each for Zones 1 & 4 and 1 each for zones 2 & 3.

2. I have staggered the closing dates for the 2 Bowl Singles, 4 Bowl Singles, Pairs, Triples and Fours so that none fall on the same day. Each draw sheet has the correct closing dates on them.

3. This year I have decided to alternate the venue for each Quarter Final and Semi Final so one round will be played at Dunnington and one at York Railway. Details of this can be found on the website.

4. Inevitably there are some byes through the first round. In order to try and make it fairer, those without a bye, if they win, will play most of their matches at home if they keep winning.

5. The Over 55 Fours will play down to a final and has been drawn roughly in zones.

6. The Over 65 Pairs and Fours has also been drawn and will be played at 4 different venues in Phase 1, before the Quarter and Semi Finals at Thirsk.

7. In Zones 3 & 4 the 2 Bowl singles are on fixed dates; Zone 3 at Driffield on Sunday 8th June and Zone 4 at York Railway on Sunday 22nd June.

8. The Under 24 Singles and Pairs will also be on a fixed date and I will send out details to those that have entered once that has been finalised with the new YBA Youth Development Officer, David Attwood. We will try and make those dates after the GCSE and A Level exam season.

9. County Finals Day was due to be played in Zone 3 this year at Driffield Bowling Club, but they have unfortunately double booked their green. I have therefore taken the decision to use Zone 4 and the York Railway Bowls & Social Club for our Finals Day on Sunday 20th July. We will hopefully revert back to Zone 3 in 2026.

10. Remember for each competition the first drawn in each pair shall be termed the 'challenger' and the second the 'opponent'. Unless competitions are being played on selected dates the challenger shall, at the latest in respect of any round to be played, at least seven days before that round closure, offer their opponent at least two dates, none of which shall be the last day of the period of the round nor be on the same day as a county match or county competition fixed date match. The time for commencing a match

shall be mutually agreed but no player shall be compelled to accept a time earlier than 6pm Monday to Friday or 3pm on Saturdays and Sundays, nor later than 6:30pm on any day. The challenger in singles matches will provide a marker and failure to do so will mean forfeiture of the round. In the event of a match being rained off etc. and the players not being able to agree another date, they should inform the Men's Competitions Secretary immediately.

11. Also remember that there must be a draw for the rink before the game starts. At least two rinks must be put in the draw.

All other rules can be found in the constitution on the county website.

I hope you all have an enjoyable season, and I look forward to seeing how all the competitions progress during 2025.

A reminder: If your club/county is affiliated to Bowls England, it must always follow the procedures set out in **Regulation 9** when dealing with complaints alleging misconduct. In its rules, your club/county must include provision that it will adopt and follow all the procedures in Regulation 9, 9A and 9B when dealing with any type of disciplinary/misconduct issues. This is a qualification of membership to Bowls England and can be found in Regulation 2.5.2.

Play Bowls

BE are pleased to announce that the updated Play Bowls site will launch to all affiliated clubs the week commencing 14th April. The site has undergone significant development, the purpose of which was to create a more comprehensive club finder for current and potential players whilst also creating a 'one stop shop' for all club data.

This will enable clubs to better publicise themselves among the bowls community – whilst offering potential new players an easy way to find nearby clubs and everything they have to offer, from 'Pay and Pay' and Bowls Bash sessions to full memberships.

Clubs will also be able to provide additional information about their facilities, and to input contact information for key personnel including Secretary, Greenkeeper and Safeguarding Officer that can then be used by counties and Bowls England to provide relevant updates.

What's New

The site now includes all affiliated clubs, regardless of whether they are signed up to offer 'Pay and Play' sessions. This creates a single place for potential players to visit and a simple system for them to find a club local to them.

Clubs can assign editing capabilities to those with roles in their club, therefore, sharing the responsibility of keeping this information up to date. Roles can opt in to Bowls England communications relating directly to their position at the club - for example, the greenkeeper can opt in to receive 'Cutting Edge' and the Safeguarding Officer to the 'Safeguarding Bulletin'.

What's Next

From Monday 14th April, emails will be sent from BE to clubs informing them of the updates made. A login will then be automatically sent to those who are listed as the main contact (likely the secretary) - these contacts have come from the current Bowls England website.

BE will ask clubs to log on to their profile and ensure all details are up to date, to input roles held at their club (to share responsibility of the club profile) and consider signing up as a 'Pay and Play' club (to generate additional revenue and have a more prominent listing on the site).

Aligned with the launch of the new club finder on Play Bowls, the club pages on the Bowls England website will be shut down, the log in for the site will be turned off with no content hidden and everything will point to Play Bowls for those wishing to find clubs. Therefore, updates to club details will no longer be required on <u>bowlsengland.com</u>.

You can find out more about the developments at <u>bowlsengland.com/playbowls</u>, including a list of FAQs.
